The Northern Climate Network is a campus-wide consortium providing opportunities for faculty, staff, students and community members to discuss and learn about climate change in our region.

The mission of the Northern Climate Network is two-fold:

1. Share current scholarship on climate change from a wide range of disciplines – from the arts and social to biology and atmospheric science to engineering and leadership.
2. Build an interactive database of people interested in working on and teaching about climate change at NMU.

The Northern Climate Network will facilitate communication. We will begin by inviting our members to give “general audience, TED-style” talks about their climate change-related work. These talks would be part of a regular (bi-weekly or monthly) colloquia series about climate change research, projects and teaching at NMU. At the minimum, the colloquia would be a small group of passionate people gathered in an empty classroom. At most, we could host catered, public events with full-color, glossy posters. Either way, **the ultimate goal is to start building a collaborative network of climate change scholars** and provide a forum for them to speak to each other and non-specialist audiences.
